PICKAPONY

Back-to-school doesn't have to mean nerdy ponytails. Many of our favourite celebs love tying up their hair so be inspired by their cool styles and rock the trend

SHAPING UP

Shelene Shaer of Tanaz Hair (011-786-2976, 021-425-9655) gives advice on which pony is best for the shape of your face.

ROUND Your face is almost as wide as it is long.

The pony for you A ponytail high on your head suits you best. It will add height, make your face appear thinner and give it more length. Don't wear a middle parting; rather choose a side parting.

SQUARE You have a strong jawline and your face is as wide as it is long.

The pony for you Pull out some pieces so you have loose strands of hair next to your face. This will soften your angular features. Wear an off-centre parting.

LONG Your face is longer than it is wide.

The pony for you Make two pigtails, tease and scrunch them and pin into buns near your ears. This will help accentuate your cheekbones and make your face look wider. Wear a zigzag parting.

HEART-SHAPED Your face is narrow at the jawline, wide at the cheekbones and/or forehead and you have a pointy chin.

The pony for you Wear a low ponytail with a fringe, or hair swept across your forehead. This will make a wide forehead look smaller.

Wispy strands

Both actresses have the controlled messy look just right. Pull a few strands of hair from your pony to hang loose around your face. But don't overdo it – you don't want the teachers on your case!

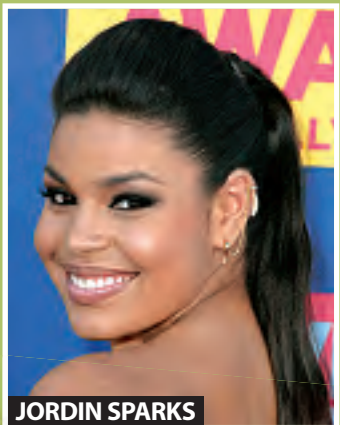

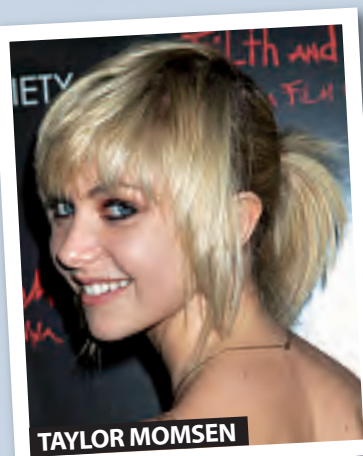
